What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

Youth and Family Ministry: In collaboration with senior staff and members, create a program of youth events aimed at revitalizing the youth and family ministry. This initiative seeks to engage both youth and young families in meaningful ministry and service activities while also fostering their integration into the broader life of the church. Adult Education: Enhancing the spiritual growth of members by leading worship and providing inspiration from the pulpit; working with the Adult Education and Spirituality Committee to develop educational opportunities for adults; provide leadership to intellectually and spiritually challenge members to grow in biblical knowledge and understanding; and to help deepen the faith of members and their understanding of broader community and global issues through educational programs and events. Mission: Supporting the work of the Mission Committee, and assisting it in identifying mission programs and hands-on mission projects for members; encouraging a focus on service to the wider community by supporting and promoting mission programs offering financial assistance to local, national, and international communities; participating in interfaith activities; demonstrating concern for broader social justice issues.
